




# Expanding Our Impact Membership increased from 203 in June of 2023 to **226** in May 2024, up 11%!




## **FINANCES**

In 2022, the Estero Chamber of Commerce engaged Grasmeier Business Consulting, a local CPA firm, to conduct an informal review of their internal bookkeeping files. This review led to several accounting adjustments and the preparation of a compilation report. Additionally, Grasmeier Business Consulting handled the preparation of the 2022 Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax.

Moving into 2023, the Chamber's accounting team recommended transitioning to the QuickBooks online platform to streamline their financial processes.

Consequently, the internal bookkeeping was also transitioned to Grasmeier Business Consulting. Beyond preparing the 2023 Form 990, the consulting firm played a pivotal role in assisting with the budgeting process and accounting for special events.



#### **Income Report**

The financial activities of the Estero Chamber of Commerce in 2023 saw a gross income of \$164,685.05, sourced from various streams:

Event Income: \$46,496.68
 Membership Dues: \$55,441.17
 Sponsorship Income: \$54,500.00

4. Other Income: \$8,271.72

Sponsorship Income was the largest contributor, representing 34% of the total gross income.

## **FINANCES**



#### **Expense Report**

For the fiscal year 2023, the Estero Chamber of Commerce incurred operational and administrative expenses across various categories. Some of the significant expenses are as follows:

1. Event Expenses: \$33,141.32

2. Marketing Expenses: \$13,075.87

3. Gross Wages: \$36,520.784. Rent Expense: \$30,494.235. WEB/IT Expense: \$9,867.46

Total amount of Expenses for the year is \$153,256.26.

The largest expense categories for the year were (1) Gross Wages (\$36,520.78), this is despite the fact that the President, Katy Errington, waived her salary at the start of her term and received only a gross salary of \$13,900.00 during the year, (2) Event Expenses (\$33,141.32) and (3) Rent Expense (\$30,494.23). These figures reflect the Chamber's commitment to maintaining a dedicated workforce, securing appropriate facilities, and hosting successful events. Marketing and Web/IT expenses also represent significant investments, highlighting the Chamber's efforts to enhance its visibility and digital presence.

The Estero Chamber of Commerce managed its expenses prudently while investing in key areas that support its mission and operations. The detailed breakdown of expenses demonstrates a balanced approach to managing operational costs, personnel expenses, and event-related expenditures, ensuring the Chamber's ongoing effectiveness and community engagement.

#### Conclusion

Despite substantial expenses, the Estero Chamber of Commerce ended the year with a net income of \$11,428.79, demonstrating prudent financial management and a balanced approach to operational costs, personnel expenses, and event-related expenditures. The detailed breakdown of our income and expenses highlights our strategic focus on maintaining operational efficiency and community involvement. We remain committed to our goals and look forward to continuing our work in the community with the same dedication and prudence in the coming years.

A major focus of the administration of the Chamber this past year has been maximizing value out of all our expenses. This includes an almost all volunteer work-force, with even the President waiving most of her salary.

## COMMUNICATIONS

#### Website Refresh October 2023

Papyrus worked with Chambermaster staff to redesign and remake the Chamber website. A new template, navigation, and new content made the site easier to use, more engaging upon first visit, and capable of staying current with events as they unfold.

The new site design allowed us to create custom pages for major events, sponsorship grids and more.

The website received 11K visitors in the past year. The home page was visited most, followed by the EsteroFest event pages, the main event listing page, the golf tournament page, and other events.

The website gains over 60% of traffic from Organic Search, which means users find it easily using search engines.
